# VCJC ANNUAL GALA HONORING HOWARD E. KAMIEL



On Sunday, June 30<sup>th</sup>, the Van Cortlandt Jewish Center held its 22<sup>nd</sup> annual Journal Gala honoring Howard E. Kamiel. This year's event was held in the ballroom of Hebrew Institute of Riverdale, and catered by 8<sup>th</sup> Day Caterers. Both the venue and caterer were new this year since the Riverdale K Grill House, which had been both the venue and caterer for the previous two years, had gone out of business. The event was co-chaired by Ceil Hartstein and Phil Friedman.

The event began with a cocktail hour, featuring hors d'oeuvres passed around by the serving staff. As had become traditional, the formal program was opened by our President, Bob Gillman, welcoming everybody to the event. Bob then introduced our State Assemblyman, Jeffrey Dinowitz, who spoke of his longstanding connection with VCJC. In a unique move, Mr. Dinowitz presented a proclamation to our honoree, but then took it back to correct an error in the proclamation, which had erroneously stated that Howard had been retired for four decades (he actually retired in 2008, only one decade ago).

The program was then turned over to the MC for the afternoon, Ceil Hartstein, co-chair of the Journal Gala committee. Ceil led in the singing of the Star-Spangled Banner. This was followed by Rabbi David Borenstein leading the singing of Hatikvah, which was most

## AN UPDATE TO THE COMMUNITY ON THE POSSIBLE SALE OF THE VCJC BUILDING

The June issue of the Center Light had a report on the May General Membership meeting. It cited a request made to the membership to approve the plan to sell the building because of economic reasons, which was not accepted at that meeting.

Instead, we were directed to develop written material outlining the situation and justifying the need for the sale. We were further directed to then hold a Special Membership meeting to discuss and seek approval.

It is the position of the officers and the Committee for the Future of the VCJC that we want that approval BEFORE investing a lot of time and effort, and possibly some money, in pursuing a sale that might ultimately be denied by the membership.

Having said that, the Center Light notice has generated a lot of concern and rumors in the neighborhood and community, as well as with our tenants. This article is meant to clarify the current situation, quell the rumors, and let you know what is and is not happening.

The Board of Trustees has had a regular meeting since the General Membership meeting and the Center Light article. It approved the following motion.

Whereas the VCJC is now in its fourth location, and whereas we do not wish to dissolve the congregation, and whereas our financial situation does not support our continuing to own the current building, the Board approves efforts to explore the options to sell the building and further approves, subject to final Board and membership approval of the details of any sales agreement, the sale of the building.



# AN UPDATE ON THE VCJC BUILDING - continued

An identical motion will be brought before the Special Membership meeting.

As the motion makes clear, we are not dissolving the congregation. Instead, we are seeking to find another way to house it and relieve the costs and effort involved in maintaining our current building.

We will make every effort to treat our tenants, the JASA operated Senior Center and the Mosholu Montefiore Community Center pre-school program, fairly, and if we can, to provide a place for them. In addition, we have legal, contractual obligations to them to which we will adhere.

While we are planning to actively pursue sale of the building with the membership's approval, and are, in fact, already doing some preliminary explorations, we are not ignoring the possibility of being able to stay in the building if we can improve our finances.

While at this juncture it would be premature to post the financial information for the membership, it is probably clear to all concerned that our decreasing membership rolls have a significant direct impact on our finances.

When the building was built we had over 700 members. We now have less than 70. We are reaching out to the Jewish community at large, and have been having discussions for a few years, to look for ways to rebuild our membership rolls. If that is successful, and we hope it will be, then we will not necessarily need to sell the building. We don't need to get back to 700 members to be viable in this location, but we do need a significant increase.

Even within the bounds of a building sale, there is a wide range of possibilities of what could happen. These range from:

- an outright sale and our congregation moving to another facility, possibly through purchase or rental, to
- selling the building to a developer who would build a new structure in which we, and possibly our current tenants, would have a place, to
- selling the building and relocating to a renovated 67 Stevenson Place. This option might represent something as simple as reconfiguring the current Cantor's quarters to serve as the congregation's home and possibly the site of the senior center as well.

# AN UPDATE ON THE VCJC BUILDING - continued

At this point nothing is set in stone and we are looking at all possibilities.

We hope that this information clarifies our situation and actions. In summary:

- We feel that it is not financially viable for us to continue to be the owners of our current building.
- We have asked, and been directed to present a more detailed report to the membership, for membership approval of a sale in general principles.
- We are pursuing other avenues that would improve our financial situation and might eliminate the need to sell the building.

We don't anticipate that this process will move quickly and we assure you that we will keep everyone informed to the extent that we can as we proceed.

Rabbi Borenstein then spoke about his own nine-year history at VCJC, recounting how he was hired, and some of the highlights of his career, and thanking the many congregants who were helpful to, and supportive of him, during those years.

Each year, one of the highlights of our annual Gala is the family remarks. This year was no exception. Ceil introduced Howard's wife Tere Kamiel, who spoke of their close bond and many happy years together. Her remarks were then followed by an excellent buffet, featuring a variety of meat, fish, and pasta dishes.

Following the buffet, Phil Friedman, speaking as co-chair, thanked the many people responsible for the gala and accompanying journal. He singled out four people for special mention: his co-chair Ceil Hartstein, for the excellent job in identifying and working with the new venue and caterer; Marcy Harris, who, operating behind the scenes, was invaluable in the preparation of the menu, working on some of the journal ads, and preparing the seating for the event; Jack Kleinfeld, whose computer expertise was critical in enabling in-house preparation of the Journal, and our honoree, Howard Kamiel. Howard had established a self-imposed target of making this one of the most financially successful Journals and having a significant turnout for the event. He was successful on both counts.

Following this, Bob Gillman presented the traditional plaque to our honoree. Ceil Hartstein followed by presenting a special gift, a Fitbit, which had been picked out by Howard's wife, Tere.

It was then Howard's turn to respond. Before the speech, he had claimed it would only take 90 seconds. However, because his emotions took hold two or three times during the speech, it actually ran 4 minutes and 20 seconds, but every bit was enjoyed by the audience.

## **BECOME A SPONSOR**

Celebrating a special occasion, such as a significant birthday or anniversary, or a birth, wedding or graduation in the family? Or observing a yahrzeit? Or just want to honor a special person or event? Why not share it with the congregation by sponsoring a **Shalosh Seudos or mini-Kiddush**?

The **Shalosh Seudos** (third meal) is a light meal held every Shabbos afternoon between the mincha (afternoon) and maariv (evening) services. The menu can be customized but usually consists of sliced gefilte fish, tuna fish or egg salad, other light foods, fresh fruit, cookies or pastries, challah and crackers, and soda. The cost of sponsoring is approximately \$50 depending on the final menu. \$10 of this amount is a donation to the VCJC.

The **mini-Kiddush** is held every Shabbos morning in the Boyarsky Hall immediately following services. It consists of wine and grape juice for reciting the Kiddush, accompanied by a variety of pareve pastries and cookies. The cost to sponsor is a more modest \$25.

A **third option** is sponsoring one of the monthly lectures held between January and June. Preceding each lecture, we serve a light breakfast of bagels, cream cheese and lox along with coffee. Sponsorship costs \$100.

If you wish to be a **sponsor** for any of these events, simply contact the office to book the date, preferably at least two weeks in advance. The office staff will take care of making all the arrangements. We look forward to your participation in these programs.
