STATE OF THE SHUL

Our shul is going through many things as of the writing of this statement. First is the Special Membership meeting held on July 28th, to take up the matter of your Board of Trustees request for permission to explore a possible sale or other disposition of our building. It may change the location of our congregation, or make arrangements to remain in the building in a different capacity. The Board has discussed many options which were reported at the Special Membership meeting. The Board has been clear that we have no intention of dissolving the Congregation, but rather of finding a solution to the economic dilemma we find ourselves in. The resulting decision will have a major effect on our future. I am pleased that the membership has seen the financial problems for what they are, and has given the Board the leeway they need to make a more financially viable congregation.

The next big change is one that you have heard about already. Our Rabbi, David Borenstein, who has been with us for almost 10 years, and his family are making Aliyah to Israel by the end of August of this year. This is the second big problem facing our Board of Trustees. Our Rabbi has given great service to our congregation and will be both greatly missed and difficult to replace. We will be having a brunch on August 18th at 10:30 am to honor the Rabbi's service to the Van Cortlandt Jewish Center. You should have received a letter about the event in the mail near the end of July. There was a tear-off on the bottom to reserve a seat at the table for this event. Please send your payment of \$10 per person so that we will know how many will be attending to honor our departing Rabbi.

SPECIAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING HELD JULY 28, 2019

A special membership meeting was held to consider the following resolution:

Whereas, the VCJC is now in its fourth location, and

Whereas VCJC does not wish to dissolve the congregation, and

Whereas our financial situation does not support our continuing to own the current building,

Now therefore be it resolved that the Membership of VCJC approves and authorizes the Board of Trustees of VCJC to explore the sale or other disposition of the building and further

Resolved that no sale or other disposition of the building shall be completed without the further approval of the Membership of VCJC.

The resolution had been considered and adopted unanimously by the Board of Trustees at its July meeting. The Board directed that it be presented to the membership for its approval. As a result, a special meeting was called in accordance with the VCJC by-laws, which require a ten day written notification of the meeting. This was provided to all members, along with an information packet on the background of our situation as it related to the need for the resolution. When convened, the meeting attendance by members exceeded the quorum requirements for a membership meeting.

The need for the resolution is driven by the financial situation of the VCJC and the foreseeable expenses of maintaining our current building. As presented to (continued page 5)

TISHA B'AV

The Fast of the Ninth of Av, is a day of mourning to commemorate the many tragedies that have befallen the Jewish people, many of which have occurred on the ninth of Av.

Tisha B'Av primarily commemorates the destruction of the first and second Temples, both of which were destroyed on the ninth of Av. Also it is the culmination of a three week-period of increasing mourning beginning with the fast of the 17th of Tammuz.

In the synagogue, the book of Lamentations is read and mourning prayers are recited.

the membership by mail prior to the meeting and reviewed by me at the meeting, we are facing significantly larger building expenses than our cash flow or assets can support.

Our membership when the building was first opened was over 700, it is now under 70. That has a direct impact on our ability to stay in the black, even with most of our space rented to the MMCC pre-school program and the JASA-operated Senior Center.

While some efforts have already been made to identify possibilities for sale of the building, the Executive Committee and the Committee for the Future of the VCJC were not willing to proceed with their efforts unless the membership gave some assurance that they backed the efforts by passing the resolution.

Following the presentation of the highlights of our situation and discussion among the members, the resolution was passed by a vote of 29 to 5 in a roll call vote. As a result, the committees and the Board will continue their efforts.

To be clear, NYS law requires that a final disposition of the building will require approval of the NYS Attorney General's office as well as approval of the actual deal by the VCJC membership. The approved resolution gives those of us working on this some assurance that the membership will not reject a deal out of hand because they do not want to sell.

Additionally, to repeat what the resolution states: this is not agreement to dissolve the congregation or to cease operations. In fact, it is a necessary step to avoid dissolving it because of bankruptcy.

While not reported at the meeting, we have had some interesting possibilities presented to us in our discussions with the real estate world. These include, among others, the possibility that the building will be replaced with a multi-family residence in which there would be community space for the VCJC, possibly for the Senior Center, and even possibly for the MMCC pre-school. That is a description of what might happen. It is not a prediction, nor a promise. What we can assure you of is that we will make every effort to provide for the continuation of the VCJC, for a place for the Senior Center, and circumstances permitting, for the MMCC pre-school.

In addition to pursuing the sale possibilities, we will also pursue efforts to increase our membership. These efforts involve making people in other areas aware of Van Cortlandt Village and the VCJC, their benefits and cost competitiveness. That is particularly aimed at people who are considering relocating and we hope identifies us to them as a possible new home. We will also be trying to reach out to current neighbors, whether previously members or not, and encourage them to become involved and members at VCJC.

BECOME A SPONSOR

Celebrating a special occasion, such as a significant birthday or anniversary, or a birth, wedding or graduation in the family? Or observing a yahrzeit? Or just want to honor a special person or event? Why not share it with the congregation by sponsoring a **Shalosh Seudos or mini-Kiddush?**

The **Shalosh Seudos** (third meal) is a light meal held every Shabbos afternoon between the mincha (afternoon) and maariv (evening) services. The menu can be customized but usually consists of sliced gefilte fish, tuna fish or egg salad, other light foods, fresh fruit, cookies or pastries, challah and crackers, and soda. The cost of sponsoring is approximately \$50 depending on the final menu. \$10 of this amount is a donation to the VCJC.

The **mini-Kiddush** is held every Shabbos morning in the Boyarsky Hall immediately following services. It consists of wine and grape juice for reciting the Kiddush, accompanied by a variety of pareve pastries and cookies. The cost to sponsor is a more modest \$25.

A **third option** is sponsoring one of the monthly lectures held between January and June. Preceding each lecture, we serve a light breakfast of bagels, cream cheese and lox along with coffee. Sponsorship costs \$100.

If you wish to be a **sponsor** for any of these events, simply contact the office to book the date, preferably at least two weeks in advance. The office staff will take care of making all the arrangements. We look forward to your participation in these programs.
